## Nesting Bowls <br> Design and Media

I. Criteria
a. 3 closely sized bowls, able to "nest" (sit comfortably) together
i. Bowls must be no smaller than 1 " and no larger than 5 " in diameter.
b. Each bowl must be glazed/decorated differently than the other two

## II. Steps:

a. Choose shape of mouth of bowl.
b. Draw out bowl shape in three different sizes, no smaller than 1 inch and no bigger than 5 inches
c. Get designs/drawings approved.
d. Roll out slab of clay ( $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ thick)
e. Cut out rectangle of clay to form bowl walls.
f. Use drawings as a template for forming the bowl walls.
g. Score and slip edges of rectangle together to form one solid wall.
h. Use wall to trace a shape for the bottom on a slab of clay.
i. Score and slip the bottom to the walls.
j. Lightly write name and hour on bottom of bowl using scratch tool
k. Repeat steps 4-9 for other two bowls.

1. Ensure all bowls fit (nest) together loosely.
m. Once fired, choose three glazes or patterns for the bowls.
